TRAIN DISASTER! PLUNGE INTO BAY TAKES HEAVY TOLL Death strikes swiftly when a New Jersey commuter train plunges from an open drawbridge into Newark Bay. A passenger car hangs grotesquely half in and half out of the water. Two diesels and two coaches lie beneath the surface. Crowds of curious watch the rescue operation as a clergyman is sped to the scene. Reports on the number of dead rise steadily. But until the coaches are raised, the final toll remains uncertain. More than 30 persons are injured. Some escaped by breaking through coach windows. Some are too dazed to remember how they got out. They only know they're among the lucky ones. Meanwhile, the hanging car has vanished beneath the water. A tragic disaster in which there was no panic. There wasn't time!
