

GENERAL DE GAULLE TOURS FRENCH CITIES

Premier Charles de Gaulles yesterday ended a flying tour of four important cities of France in support of his proposed constitution which will be submitted to the french people's approval next sunday.

② In RENNES (Brittany) first on Saturday morning he addressed a crowd of thousands and thousands asking them for the sake of France's future to say "Yes" to the proposed constitution which will give stability to the Assembly and government, and thus make it possible for France to enjoy new economic and social progresses.

① Then in BORDEAUX he reaffirmed his faith in the future of France and said he was confident in its rebirth as a great nation. Everywhere he was hailed by thousands, although in Bordeaux a handfull of demonstrators tried to interrupt and were promptly put off by police forces.

3 Yesterday morning it was under pouring rains that he arrived in STRASBOURG where church bells rang in greeting and where he attended mass in the Cathedral.

4 In all the towns visited General de Gaulle called for and predicted overwhelming approval of the constitution in next Sunday's balloting. He said this would lead to stable government and restore the "Grandeur of France".

Returning then to LILLE the northern city where he was born 67 years-ago General de Gaulle was acclaimed by a crowd of over 30,000 when he addressed it from the balcony of the TownHall. He was surrounded by several Ministers of his cabinet, among them was Mr. Guy Mollet socialist leader also of Northern France. Everywhere, general de Gaulle walked through the crowd and chatted with hundreds of war veterans, miners or some of his faithfull supporters?
