INTERPOL SEES YARD:

Police heads of 42 countries had a busman's holiday when they dropped into Scotland Yard. They were in London for an international conference to discuss greater co-speration in the fight against crime. Stolen cars, they learned, are one of the biggest headaches of the London Police. In the Metropolitan area meanly 100 vehicles are reported missing every week. The locality of each theft is noted and many cars are recovered.
