On behalf of the Citizens of Carlisle the City Council expresses the profound pleasure occasioned by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II having graciously consented to visit the City, accompanied by His Royal Highness The Prince Philip, on the 16th October, 1958, in connection with the City's Octo-Centenary Celebrations, illness having prevented Her Majesty from visiting the City on the 8th July last.

3.10 p.m.

HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN AND HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE PHILIP, attended by Lady Alice Egerton, C.V.O., Lady in Waiting; Sir Edward Ford, K.C.V.O., C.B., Assistant Private Secretary to Her Majesty; and Lieut. Commander Peter Campbell, R.N., Equerry in Waiting to Her Majesty, will arrive at Citadel Station.

Her Majesty and His Royal Highness will be received at the Station by the Lord Lieutenant of Cumberland (Sir Robert Chance, B.A., J.P.). Her Majesty and His Royal Highness will then be received by the Mayor of Carlisle (Councillor Irving Burrow).

After the Royal Salute the Guard of Honour will be inspected by Her Majesty.

A Royal Salute of twenty-one guns will be fired from the Castle by the 251st (Westmorland and Cumberland Yeomanry) Field Regiment, R.A. (T.A.).

During the inspection the Mayor and Mayoress, accompanied by the Recorder and Town Clerk, will proceed by car to the Town Hall in order to receive Her Majesty and His Royal Highness on arrival there.

3.20 p.m.

The Royal Party will proceed by way of Court Square and English Street to the Town Hall and during the progress the Bells of the Cathedral will be pealed.

Her Majesty and His Royal Highness on arrival at the Town Hall will be received by the Mayor and conducted to a dais in front of the Town Hall.

The Mayor will invite Her Majesty to unveil a plaque commemorating the visit of Her Majesty and His Royal Highness to the City. Her Majesty will be graciously pleased to unveil the plaque.

The plaque contains the following inscription:—

This plaque was unveiled on the 16th October, 1958, by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II on the occasion of an official visit to the City by Her Majesty and His Royal Highness, The Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, during celebrations which marked the eight hundredth anniversary of the granting of civic independence conferred by Royal Charter of Henry II.

The City Coat of Arms is raised from the background of the plaque in relief and coloured to the heraldic notation.

The Mayor will invite Her Majesty and His Royal Highness to sign the Distinguished Visitors Book and will also invite Her Majesty to autograph a photograph of herself.

3.40 p.m.

The Royal Procession will leave the Town Hall and proceed by way of Castle Street and St. Mary's Gate to the Market Hall where the Infant and Junior School Children of the City will be assembled. Her Majesty and His Royal Highness will walk round the assembled ranks of children, and the children will sing to Her Majesty and His Royal Highness.

3.55 p.m.

Her Majesty and His Royal Highness will proceed on a tour of the City over the following route:

Market Street, Peter Street, Warwick Street, Rickergate, Bridgewater Road, Hardwicke Circus, Lowther Street, Victoria Place, Albert Street, Strand Road, Hartington Street, Victoria Place, Lismore Place, Aglionby Street, Myddleton Street, Fusehill Street, Grey Street, London Road, Botchergate, Court Square, English Street, Castle Street to the Cathedral.

Her Majesty and His Royal Highness accompanied by the Dean will make a tour of inspection of the Cathedral. During the inspection the Cathedral organ will be played and an Anthem will be sung by the Cathedral Choir.

The Royal Procession will leave the Cathedral and proceed by way of Castle Street, English Street and Court Square to the Citadel Station where the members of the Reception Party will take leave of Her Majesty and His Royal Highness.
