PRANCE HONOURS STR WINSTON.

For the first time for 14 years Sir Winston Churchill met General de Gaulle and a wartime partnership was remembered. The garden of the Hotel de Matigman, official residence of French Frunces, had a more peaceful atmosphere than the London of the World War, where the British and French leaders worked together, though not without the occasional conflict of opinion. But while two men of such apposite temperaments couldn't help alsohing now and then, each understood and respected the other.

Now De Geulle conferred upon Sir Winston the Cross of Liberation. Newsdays, it's the honour most prized in France. Only two other non-Franchmen have received it. President Eisenhowen and the King of Moroeco.

There was another honour to come, and to see the second presentation Ledy Churchill was there. The accent of the day was on the Liberation of France. It is never forgetten by the General that that salvation was wrought partly by Frenchmen and the Free French. Their emblem was presented to Sir Minston, in cyrutal form, the Grees of Lorraine. As the 1,051-th Companion of the Liberation, Sir Winston wishes well to his old comrade in arms, General de Gaulle.
