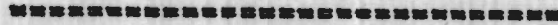

BRITISH WOMAN HUMANITARIAN AT
VARIETY CLUB LUNCHEON



* Miss Sue Ryder, O.B.E., the 35-years-old British humanitarian, is to be one of the guests of honour at the Variety Club of Great Britain's luncheon at the Savoy Hotel, London, on July 8.

Since the war Miss Ryder has devoted herself to helping war victims, mainly survivors of Hitler's concentration camps, on the Continent, and has just established a St. Christopher Settlement at Gross-Burgweder, North of Hanover, for the permanent rehousing of sick people.

* Miss Ryder won the O.B.E. for her work, and her experiences are recounted in a biography by A.J. Forrest, who is attending the luncheon and will speak.

The other main guests are comedians Harry Secombe and Eric Sykes, who are currently starring at the London Palladium, and cricketer Denis Compton.

Sir Tom O'Brien, M.P., Chief Barker (president) of Variety Club, is presiding, and 'King for the Day' Oliver Ward will introduce the guests.
