WHAT I THINK WE NEED IS TO GIVE THE POLICE EVERY ENCOURAGEMENT. NOW SOME PEOPLE SAY THAT THERE ARE TOO MANY ON TRAFFIC DUTIES BUT IN FACT WE HAVE ANALYSED THAT AND I DON'T THINK THERE ARE. YOU SEE THE ROAD TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS IN FACT ACCOUNT FOR MORE LOSS OF LIFE THAN ANY THING EVEN THE CRIMINALS DO, SO WE MUST KEEP A BALANCE BETWEEN THE TWO.

ROBBERIES ALARM GOVERNMENT

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Spate of cosh-and-grab and currency snatches results in new amti-erime measures.

Prom two concealed camera positions, one shoeting through back of car, the other if possible elevated, the following shots are taken:

Exterior: Midland Bank, Spitafields.
Two men leave bank with large bag, which is attached by a chain to the wrist of one of them. They hail a taxi, which is just slowly cruising by. They give address and get in .

It happened one day. Things more or less like it happen on many days.

Bank clerk and messenger were taking £16,000 to the head office.

The above action is taken in one shot by bothcameramen. This provides for cross cutting and a look of actuality. The people passing by don't know any films are being taken. It is done in one take: no repeats.

Every week - same time, same day - they made the journey. Always by taxi.

The first taxi that came along. They never had to wait more than seconds.

This time there was no waiting at all.

Interior taxi as it travels. The two men in back seat.

Full C.U. showing that bag with money is chained to wrist of messenger.

Interior taxi. Men lean over
slightly as taxi turns into side r
road. The leaning over must not
be too pronounced, as the scene
visible through back window will
show that taxi is turning.

Men register small surprise at change of direction.

One of them says (for subsequent dubbing) "Where's he going?"

It was only a fifteen-minute run to the head office. As a precaution against the bag being snatched it was chained to the messenger's wrist. Exterior: Back street. Taxi

'is seen in distance turning
into this street

Out of the traffic into a quiet back street.

Exterior: Yard of a disused factory shooting towards gates leading to the street. Two men, masked with nylon stockings over their faces open the gates. Taxi swings into yard.

Out of the street into the yard of a disused old factory.

A perfect ambush. The taxi
was stolen. The whole thing
perfectly planned. The swag.
£16,000

Exterior: Street, facing gates, which are quickly closed.

At a Euston Road ironmongers, shortly before that robbery, a man bought some large bolt cutters. As he seemed uncertain of the kind he wanted, and wasn't the type of man who uses that sort of thing, the shop assistant was suspicious. He noted the number of the man's car.

When he read about the robbery he told the police: information that led to an arrest and the recovery of some of the money.

Several banks have been the centre of these modern robbery raids. Several firms have had their wage-money stolen, between bank and factory. Some ingenious inventions would make it almost impossible for a smash-and-grab man to get away with the money or to escape capture on the spot. Meanwhile, hardly a week goes by without a sensational robbery.
