The Voice of Berlin

In 1948, the Wester^RAllies moved to the edge of war rather than to surrender their rights in Berlin to a Russian blokade. Last week Zhrushchew by implication renewed that threat in a prepared speech at a reception for Mr. Gomulka and his Polish delegation.
