## The Voice of Berlin

In 1948, the Western Allies moved to the edge of war rather than to surrender their rights in Berlin to a Russian blockade. Last week Khrushchew by implication renewed that threat in a prepared speech at a reception for Mr. Gomulka and his Polish delegation.

Berlin is the exposed nerve of the West and a tremor ran through Europe. What was certain was that the West would not yield to threats over Berlin and surrender to Communist control a population that had steadfastly shown its abhorrence of Communism. Our cameraman interviewed the "man in the street" in Berlin and this is what he recorded:

Zoo-Garden: "Well, we rely completely on the three Western Powers - and that is done by every Berliner".

Excavator at the Zoo: "Nothing doing... I'm not interested in politics!"

Roadworker - Kurfürstendamm:

"We just go on working"

Moving Truck:

"You see - I've got troubles of my own!"

Woman in the tiergarten:

"This is a breach of the Four Power Pact!"

Trader: "Mainthing - we can get our goods and sell the stuff."

Waiter: "Nothing is served as hot as it was cooked!"

Taxidriver:

"I'm not getting mad! That's all hot air".

Newspaper stand:

"That spelled turnovers"

Airport Tempelhof:

"Business as usual"
