DAM NEAR COMPLETION:

One of the greatest feats of engineering in history stands to the credit of the Federation of Rhodezia and Nyasaland, the Kariba Dam. Man challenged the Zambezi and that mighty river is henceforth tamed, a servant submissive to human will. At one of its most turbulent points the Zambezi is forever harmosped.

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The last outlet was being blocked. Through the massive obstruction of the concrete wall now flowed only a trickle of Zambesi water. Even that would cease when the last loads of rock and earth had been tipped over.

To inspect progress divers were used. Below the dam scarcely more than a brook ran over the river bed, and even that will dry out as the lake upstream, above the dam, slowly grows to its planned length of 175 miles. The lake will eventually cover an area of 2 thousand square miles.

Italians, who were the majority of the Europeans working on Kariba, have built a church, to give thanks for Mivine help in the work. They went in procession now to the service of dedication. The ceremony of Consecration was performed by the Reman Catholic Archbishop of Salisbury, expital of Southern Rhodesia. Well, indeed, has this mighty work been bleased, noble in imagination, perfect in execution. The water that eventually flows through will have generated immense power. The Federation will have good cause to be proud of the Kariba Dam.
