Description of cut subject : DUKE OF EDINBURGH ATTENDS CEREMONY OF ACCEPTANCE AND DEDICATION OF M.V. "JOHN ASHLEY" FOR MISSIONS TO SEAMEN, WESTMINSTER PIER.

Roll 1: Duke of Edinburgh boards the boat accompanied by Chairman of the Port of London Authority.
100' Shots of the Acceptance Ceremony - Duke receives the Builders Certificate from a representative of John Thornycroft. Duke accepts.
 Semi-general of proceedings - Bishop of London dedicates ship.

Roll 2: Shots of Duke in wheel-house taking the vessel away from Westminster Pier on the way to Wapping-Turner Pier.
100' SHOTS of the Duke waving to ships passed including 'DISCOVERY'.

Shots of journey down river - St. Pauls - Tower Bridge, The Pool.
Rolls 3/4 Arrival at Turner Pier, Wapping - Duke disembarks.
unnumbered Shot of Lord Mayor and Mayor of Westminster chatting and watching passing ships.

Shot of the small Chapel - the Ship's Chaplain - Frederick Laight in the picture.

Shot of the recreation room with its cinema screen and T.V. set and library.

Note:

The "Flying Angel" Flag flies on the River Thames and administers to the needs of seaman there and in the Port of London, in 28 Stations round the coasts, in 6 ports in Europe, 6 in Canada, 6 in South America, 1 in W. Indies, 10 in Africa, 7 in Asia, 16 in Australia and 2 in New Zealand. The Rev. Dr. John Ashley was the pioneer whose work founded the Missions to Seamen in 1856 as the result of a question by his small son, who pointed to ships becalmed in the Bristol Channel and said: "Daddy, how do those men get to Church?" The first boat was lent by Admiralty in 1951 and visited over 2000 ships
