STORY : THE DUKE OF EDINBURGH ARRIVES IN NEW DELHI.

LOCATION: AIRFORCE STATION NEW DELHI 21st HAN 59

India displayed rousing reception for the British when the Duke of Edinburgh arrived in New Delhi today. Except for the weather which was more of 'English weather' the reception was typically Indian. There was a big crowd which had travelled over 16 miles to reach the Palam Air Force Station and they patiently waited for over 2 hours for the arrival od the Comet IV which on a account of the fog in Delhi, had been diverted to Agra. Long rows of children with flowers awaited anxiously the arrival of the plane and even Mr. Nehru, who received the distinguished guest was excited about this visit. Mr. Nehru appeared in his happeest mood and he had all the smiles as he walked with the Duke after he had received him coming down the plane.

As the Comet IV taxied through the flags which had been fixed on the tarmac, Mr. Nehru, Krishna Menon and the Mrs. Asafali, the Mayor of Delhi came forward to receive the Duke. After shaking hands with Mr. Nehru, the Duke was introduced to the Mayor of Delhi who garlanded the Duke. Later Mr. Nehru introduced his daughter Indira Gandhi to the Duke. There was a crowd of Government of India Ministers and the cameramen when the Duke and Mr. Nehru obliged the photographers.

The moent Duke arrived on the saluting Base, the Navy Band played 'GOD SAVE THE KING' After the salute, the Duke inspected the Guard of Honour which was formed by the Interservices wing of Army Navy & Airforce.

The Duke was then introduced to the lined up diplomats. It was interesting to watch the Duke being garlanded by the City Fathers of the capitol of India, The were garlands after garlands and many a time the Duke asked in surprise 'Have you still many more' He was sorrounded by the children and each one of them was keen to offer his affections through the token of flowers and garlands. Several times he removed the garlands but very next moment he was again covered with flowers.

A big crowd awaited the arrival of the Duke in the city. The Police was finding it difficult to control the public. The mounted Police pushed the people behind. There was thich crowd through which the open car bringing the Duke and Mr. Nehru passed through Delhi and entered the President's House which was once the Viceroy's House. The British monograms 'GRI' are still axiti existing on the stone elephants which decorate the enterance to this great building where the Duke would stay in Delhi during his current visit.

STORY: HRH THE DUKE OF EDINBURGH AT THE INAUGRATION OF THE L6th INDIAN SCIENCE CONGRESS IN NEW DELHI.

The 46th SNDIAN SCIENCE CONGRESS for which many delegates have arrived from several parts of the world was inaugrated in New Delhi by Prime Minister Nehru, H.R.H. Prince Philip is leading the UK delegations of Scientists.

There were more than 4,000 Indian Scientis present when the Procession led by Chancellor of Delhi University, Nehru and the Duke in Academic robes arrived at the Delhi University where the Congress is taking place. It will last for several days.

Mr. Rao, the Vice Chancellor of the Delhi University greeted the delegates and in inaugrating the Science C ngress Mr. Nehru complimented the British, the US and USSR Scientists but at the same time he reminded them that too much of success of the skies might lose their hold of the earth. He praised the Duke for having come to participate in the Science Congress and admired the interests of the Duke in the development of the Scientific Reasearch.

Dr. A.L. Mudaliar who has been elected as the time President of the Lifth Indian Science Congress read his presidential address. (The time is too short to cath the plane, copies of the speech of Mudaliar and Rad are enclosed.)
