MENDERES FIT AGAIN.

Redhill County Hospital soon after he left the London Climic, where he had been recovering from the shock of his air crash of the previous week. Still under treatment at Redhill were two other survivors of the tragic accident; one of them the Premier's valet, Karim Nefes, whom he now wished a quick recovery. Nefes sustained head injuries and a broken arm. He rejoiced to see his master again, and said he prayed for a safe seturn to Turkey for all who had been preserved. It will be remembered that when the Viscount airliner crashed while trying to land at Gatwick, fifteen of the party were killed. Mr. Menderes thanked the doctors and the Matron, Miss Nichels, for the care and skill with which they had treated his fellow countrymen.

Leaving Redhill, the Turkish Premier went to Caklands
Park Farm home of Mr. and Mrs. Anthony Bailey. Pressmen were there in
force, as the farmer and his wife came to greet their distinguished
callers. Mrs. Bailey, once a murse, found Mr. Menderes and two other
men staggering from the aircraft wreekage on the evening of the grash.
She took them indoors and revived them with brandy till an ambulance
arrived. The Premier entered the house again, in happier circumstances,
to thank his benefactors. The accident prevented him from attending
the Cyprus talks, but it introduced him to an England farm and two
charming people. Anthony and Margaret Bailey have made a friend of
Mr. Menderes. He has invited them to spend a holiday in Turksy
as his guesta.
