The magnificient Moscow State University valcemed Mr. Macmillan and Mr. Selwyn Llleyd, during an interval between diplomatic talak. The atmosphere was free from the tension that was already felt at meetings in the Kremlin. A University jubiles medal a nd a two-valume history of the institution were presented to the Prime Minister. Then it was back to another meeting with the Seviet leaders. By this time, Ehruschev had made his speech demouncing as quite unacceptable the Western proposals for the future of Germany. It came as a complete surprise to Br. Macmillan, and to say the least it didn't smooth the path towards agreement between him and the Emssians. Only the tast and furebearance of the Prime Minister made it possible for discussions to go on.

It will not be Mr. Macmillan's fault if the mission to Moscow does not help the cause of peace.
