

RAND HAS EASTER SHOW.

Milner Park provided a setting of great beauty for the Rand Easter Show which year by year draws salesmen and exhibits from nearly every industrial country in the world. It all proves the importance of this market, always expanding, offered by the Union of South Africa. The accent is on International trade.
