GRAND PRIX OF MONACO Positive developed: 28 meters - 95 ft

Jack BRANHAM, of Australia in a Cooper (Nr.24) yesterday lay cooly back until the favorites in the Grand Prix de Monace were hit by hard luck, and won this great classic automobile competition which opens the 1959 season.

Jack Brahham who already won the Silverstone race last week won in Monaco his title of one of the best champions in auteracing circles. Fancus names were engaged in the competition, but the favorites Stirling Moss (on Cooper Nr. 30) had to step for meanical trouble, and before he had himself taken the lead, Jean BEERA (on Ferrari 46) had met the same misfortune. It was then the 81st lap and Jack BRABHAM took the lead which he kept until the end. Behind him were two Perraris. Tony Brooks (Mr.50) and Phil Hill (Mr.48).

Sixteen men had been at the start after the previous eliminatory competitions.
