LIST OF SHOTS Roll. 1. At the top of a glen in Pittencrief Park stands the statue of Alexander Carnegie, Scotland's greatest benefactor. He faces out through the park gates to the busy little town of Dunfermline, where in the offices of the Carnegie Memorial Trustees, a gallantly won award is being presented.

Shots for above. Pan from trees to L.S. of statue, near shot of statue, shot towards park gates and town.

N.S. of park gate being opened with nearer shot of town.

Street scene.

L.S. of gates of park, statue in the distance, suggest use as opening.
Roll. 2. Tri. X.

Brian Gibbons and his brother arriving at the headquarters of the Carnegic and Dunfermline and Hero Fund Trust and being met by Mr. Ormiston, Secretary.

Interior shots at the presentation.

L.S. of Trustees with the Chairman, Mr. A. Buchanan, announcing the award.

N.S. of presentation.

Various C.U. and N.S. around bust of Andrew Carnegie. C.U. of medal, etc.

Exterior: Brian and brother leaving premises and walking out of gate. Finishing with C.U. of name plate.
