<u>Roll. 1.</u> Overseas visitor from Wyoming. Princess Royal arriving at Royal Pavilion accompanied with Lord Forbes - then walking towards camera. Princess Royal meeting long service farm workers. Gold medal presented to <del>James</del> James Brown, aged 88, 47 years service on one farm and still working. Scottish visitor.		
Shetland pony and 10 days old foal, Rosa, with 6 months old baby who will be owner of the foal - thus the picture gives the youngest exhibit with the youngest owner. Shots of Annabel, being led from stall by owner, Mr. Cairns, winner of the President's medal <del>with</del> as the best Highland pony. Shots of Highland cattle with calf waiting to enter the ring.		
<u>Roll. 2.</u> Shot of group of herdsmen. Several shots of general view of ring with parade of horses. Chicken brooder heated by Butane gas, a by product of the oil refineries. Charles Fernandes, representative from Kenya, interviews Scots farming couple interested in going to Kenya. 2 general views of Show ground. Demonstration of agricultural equipment.		
<u>Roll. 3</u> Various shots of Mr. <sup>Ed</sup> edford and son competing in horse shoe making competition. Shots of mannequins modelling Scottish wool wear. Princess Royal at children's creche: 2 C.U.s of child in pram first crying and then interested, to cut into later shots of arrival and departure of Princess Royal.
