

DUBLIN HORSE SHOW.

The Mecca of the world's expert horsemen and women, the Dublin Horse Show, held the equestrian spotlight once again. In the Irish Trophy Event, Captain De Llano, of Spain, rode Solo the 4th, with fine judgement.

From Great Britain, Susan Cohen was up on Galway Breeze.

It was lamented by the older hands among the spectators that fewer foreign countries than usual were represented in this International event. Nevertheless the jumping and horsemanship generally were up to the standard for which the Dublin show is famed. Of course, faults were frequent, the Society's Permanent Course testing even performers of the highest class.

Golden Miller was cleverly ridden by Douglas Burn (Great Britain).

Seamus Hayes, on Kilrush, had the only faultless round of the event, thus winning the supreme individual award of the Show.
