SAILT CRESPI. WIRS PRIK DE L'ARC D. TRIOUPHE also covered by all competition 55 mm. developed positive: 69 meters -250 ft

Prince Aly Khan's SAL.T CRESPIN yesterday zas adjudged winner in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe on of the richest races in the world in a photo finish at the Lonchamps tracl in Paris before a crowd on tens of thousands under a glorious autumn sunshine.

Saint Crespin came in to what was first officially announced as a dead heat with Hidnight Sun owned by Francois Dupre of France, The race commissionners gave the first place to Saint Crispin after its jockey, the australian George Moore lodged a complaint and Hidnight Sun's jockey J. Fabre lodged a counter-claim. The commissionners examined the photo again and it was only half an hour after the end of the race that they officially announced that Saint Crespin won.

Second place went to LHE.IGHT SUE and third to LE LOUP GAROU owned by Comte D'Audiffret Pasquier, also of rance.

Prince Aly Khan's horse won a purse of 48, million Francs the richest purse in European racing and the lion's share of the 66 million francs prive morney in the race. A total of 1,656,000,000 francs in sweepstake prives was attached to the race, A first prize of 100 million francs went to the holder ar holders of ticket Eumber 1.357 series 12 (the winning horses series number).

An estimated crowd of 80,000 watching the race was thrown into a state of suspense first by the photo finish then by the announcement that there was deadheat and finally by the announcement that the deadheat itself was contested.

Saint Crespin is a three-year-old colt who was not a favorite in the race and it paid high odds of 179 france to 10 to win and 49. to 10 to place,

There were 25 starters from among Europe's best racers, including three Italian, a Swedish and a British horse. Throughout the decisive stage the race was a close struggle between Saint Crespin and Lidnight Sun,
