

KARIBA ON SCHEDULE.

The Central African Federation is very rightly proud of the progress at Kariba. Despite winter-flood setbacks almost disasters in fact - the engineers and their army of workmen have caught up the time lost. The pylons on both north and south sides are already in place. They'll carry the power-lines over the gorge. Other men are busy with the road and foot-path over the top of the dam. Telephone instructions from the other side okayed the winching of a wire over the pylons. That done, they would attach a cable to the wire, and that would be another stage towards transmitting power. Across the gorge also comes concrete - thousands of tons of it - for road building.

Above the dam, impounded water is forming a man-made lake of 2,000 square miles. All the Commonwealth hails a great achievement, the Kariba Dam.
