The Bathysphere that once belonged to the famous Swiss scientists, the Piecard Brothers, has been bought by the U.S. Nevy. The hull is filled with petral, to keep it betwent while it's below surface, the function of the Bathysphere being to explore ocean depths. As far as three miles down the strange craft can withstand the tremendous pressure. Two men have room enough in the six-and-a-half foot observation sphere, prebing the secrets of the deep waters off Southern California.
