Thank you for sending us the copy of letter to Miss Field written by the Town Clerk of Wanstead and Woodford and giving the list of music to be used at this ceremony.

Assuming that the users will be visual ones the "Royal Corps of Signals March" can be available at double the minimum schedule rate of fee. The copyright is controlled by our Members Boosey & Hawkes Ltd. Boosey & Hawkes Ltd. also control the marches "On the Quarter Deck" and "The Contemptibles" and these can be available at double the minimum schedule rate of fee plus 25%.

The march "Officer of the Day" is American owned. Do you want us to write to the U.S.A. on your behalf, or will you definitely exclude this from your film.

The remaining titles as arranged by J.L.Judd are thought to be in Ms. still and so probably the property of the composer. He is a Member of M.C.P.S. and so clearance should be possible at the double schedule rate for visual use. We are now checking on this and will let you have definite advice so soon as this is possible.

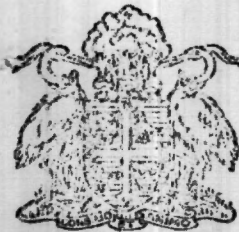

- 2.55 p.m. Arrival of Sir Winston and Lady Churchill, received by Mayoral party; Mayor conducts them to the dais, where they are looked after by the Deputy Mayor.
- 3.00 p.m. Arrival of Lord Lieutenant and Field Marshal Lord Montgomery, who are received by the Mayor. Field Marshal proceeds to centre at front of Guard of Honour whilst Lord Lieutenant and the Mayor remain on the front flank.
- 3.02 p.m. General Salute, followed by inspection of Guard of Honour by Field Marshal.
- 3.10 p.m. The Mayoral Party with Lord Lieutenant and Field Marshal complete the party on the dais.
- 3.11 p.m. Mayor welcomes distinguished visitors and introduces the ceremony.
- 3.15 p.m. Address by Field Marshal.
- 3.35 p.m. Unveiling Ceremony.
- 3.40 p.m. Prayers by Mayor's Chaplain.
- 3.42 p.m. Address by Sir Winston Churchill.
- 3.50 p.m. Vote of Thanks by Sir Stuart Mallinson.
- 4.00 p.m. National Anthem. Short interval for distinguished visitors to inspect the Statue. Public and Press and cameramen to remain in their places during this interval.
- 4.10 p.m. The Mayor and distinguished visitors leave the site for Municipal Offices.
- 4.15 p.m. Guard of Honour marches off after departure of the Mayor, Distinguished Visitors and Aldermen. They will proceed down the High Road beyond Gates Corner and embus.

Field-Marshal Montgomery unveils statue
of Sir Winston Churchill at Woodford
on Saturday 31st October, 1959.

45 (Essex) Signal Regt(TA) will provide a Guard of Honour at The Green, Woodford on 31st October, 1959 when Field-Marshal The Viscount Montgomery KG, GCB, DSO, unveils a statue of The Rt. Hon. Sir Winston Churchill.

You are cordially invited to attend this ceremony. Miss Squires of Wanstead and Woodford Borough Council (Tele:- BUC 4464) is issuing passes. I shall be happy to help you with any further queries you may have.

The Lord Lieutenant of Essex, Sir Winston and Lady Churchill, The Mayor and Alderman of the Borough of Wanstead and Woodford and Maj. Gen. W.A.G. Burns DSO, OBE, MC, GOC London District will be present at the ceremony.

I suggest your representative contacts me at the Assembly Area - Salway Hall, Forest Approach, Woodford - between 2.00 pm and 2.30 pm. Field-Marshal Montgomery is scheduled to arrive at 3.00 pm.

ARRANGEMENTS.—That part of High Road, Woodford, E.18 (A.11) known as Salway Hill will be closed to general traffic between Empress Avenue and Woodford New Road during the Ceremony. Cars will be routed so as to approach the site from the north.

Cars displaying an official label (which will accompany the admission ticket) will be parked on Salway Hill enclosure.

Guests are particularly requested to be seated by 2.30 p.m. Car park facilities will NOT be available after 2.40 p.m.

STATUE OF SIR WINSTON S. CHURCHILL

The Sir Winston Churchill Commemoration Fund was formed as the result of a public meeting convened by His Worship the Mayor, Alderman C. H. Moss, M.A., and held in the Council Chamber at Woodford on 21st January, 1958, when widespread public support was expressed for a project which would commemorate the long and honourable association between the Borough of Wanstead and Woodford and Sir Winston Churchill, who has represented this part of Essex in Parliament since 1924, first as the Member for the Epping constituency, of which the districts of Wanstead and Woodford formed the principal parts, and since 1945 as the Member for Woodford.

The people of Wanstead and Woodford will know that such benefit as Sir Winston Churchill gained 35 years ago through his adoption by them has been amply repaid by the immense volume of service which he has rendered to them throughout that period of time.

His service as Prime Minister and as Leader of the Opposition has been recorded elsewhere in the history of the nation and of the world. In May 1945, the Borough Council formally tendered "its sincere congratulations and thanks to the Prime Minister for his great leadership of the Nation during the war period culminating in the complete victory over the enemy in Europe." In September 1945, it was unanimously decided to "confer the Honorary Freedom of the Borough upon the Right Honourable Winston Leonard Spencer Churchill, C.H., M.P., in recognition of his outstanding service for the cause of Freedom, his inspiring leadership and selfless devotion in the Empire's greatest peril, and in appreciation of his eminent services to the Borough of Wanstead and Woodford." This record of events would be incomplete without adding that it was also decided at the same time to "confer the Honorary Freedom of the Borough upon Mrs. Churchill in recognition of her eminent service to the Borough, her constant, lively and benevolent interest in its institutions

"and her outstanding service to the Nation." The ceremony of presentation of the scrolls to both was held at Bancrofts School on 20th October, 1945.

It is the services of Sir Winston to the people of this constituency which we commemorate with gratitude now, his ever-ready help and guidance to every constituent who has sought it both in war and in peace, and the rare distinction which he has given to this Borough by representing it in Parliament.

The early support given by the public justified the Trustees in selecting a very eminent British sculptor to execute the work. His name is Mr. David B. McFall, A.R.A., who at the age of 40 has already many outstanding works of art to his credit. After a number of sittings and several studies, he produced the conception which was accepted by the Trustees. The statue is cast in bronze, and shows the figure standing in a characteristic attitude. The Statue is (itself) 8½ feet high, and stands on a solid six ton block of Cornish granite 4½ feet high and 6 feet wide and 3 feet from front to back. The site, which occupies a commanding position to the north of the Borough, forms part of Epping Forest, but the Conservators in granting consent have agreed to the Statue and its simple four foot surround vesting in the Borough Council during its pleasure. This site was chosen in consultation with the Sculptor.

The Statue has been offered to and accepted by the Borough Council, who have authorised its erection and will see to its maintenance in the future.

Field Marshal Viscount Montgomery of Alamein, K.G., G.C.B., D.S.O., readily accepted the invitation to perform the Unveiling Ceremony. There could be no more appropriate personage for this function than Viscount Montgomery, who until recently was Deputy Supreme Allied Commander, Europe, was formerly Chief of the Imperial General Staff, and has been during and since the war a close friend and confidant of Sir Winston Churchill.

The Field Marshal's Guard of Honour will be provided by the 45th (Essex) Signal Regiment, Territorial Army, one of the Borough's "adopted" units, by kind permission of Lt. Col. Lamb, T.D., Royal Signals, T.A. The Band of the Royal Corps of Signals, Director of Music Major J. Judd, M.B.E., B.Mus., Royal Signals, will be in attendance.
