U. S. CATHOLICS BIGGEST CHURCH

There's a new landmark in the American Capital, the largest Roman Catholic church in the whole country. The dome is 200 feet high, the spire more than 300. The edifice is called the "National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception". Five Cardinals attended the dedication ceremony, as well as every other important Catholic prelate in the United States. It was indeed a great day for the Church. Planned on the scale of a cathedral, the building has already cost 30-million dollars and the walls inside have yet to be lined with marble, eleven chapels and many altars yet to be finished.

Cardinal Spellman, Archbishop of New York, blessed the Church. 39 years have passed since the foundation stone was laid. Now, seventh largest church in the world, the vast building stands as a monument to the faith.
