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TOMMY STEELE AND BENNY HILL STIR THE LORD MAYOR'S GIANT PUDDING

The world's biggest Christmas pudding, made from 120,000 currants, 30,000 sultanas and 8,000 raisins -- all from Australia -- was stirred at Cadby Hall today (Thursday November 26) by Tommy Steele and Benny Hill.

The pudding — a massive 160-pounder which will provide portions for 1,000 people — will be presented to the Lord Mayor of London (Sir Edmund Stockdale) by the Australian High Commissioner (Sir Eric Harrison) at Australia House on December 10. It is to be a Christmas treat for members of the Wellington Boys' Club, Walworth, South East London.

Tommy Steele — who leaves London in February for a three-month tour of Australia — and Benny Hill also stirred the mixture for 100 smaller puddings which will be sent, on behalf of Australia's dried fruit growers, to cities and towns from Land's End to John o'Groats. Lord Mayors and Mayors will pass on the puddings to local charities, Darby and Joan clubs, Evergreen clubs, old folk in hospitals and W V S "meals on wheels" services.

Altogether Australia's dried fruit growers will give a helping of Christmas pudding to some 10,000 people in Britain this year.

121,450 (28 1bs) Australian currants 26,320 (27 lbs) Australian sultanas 7,250 (12 lbs) Australian raisins 108 (15 1bs) Australian lemons for peel 72 (14½ 1bs) Australian oranges for peel 25 Australian apples pulped 24½ 1bs of brown sugar $21\frac{1}{2}$ lbs of bread crumbs 18 1bs of white vegetable fat 5 lbs of flour 8 Australian eggs 4½ 1bs of pure London drinking water 4 ozs of ginger 4 ozs of mace 2 ozs cinnamon 1 cz cloves

- 1 bottle of rum
- 1 bottle of curacao
- 1 bottle of Australian brandy
