More protests were staged to-day Sunday as the City of Waterford loaded 140 horses for shipment to Dieppe. The Dublin police threatened to arrest the picketers who were parading at the North Wall, Dublin. A large banner was ~~blown~~<sup>blown</sup> by police, when they made an attempt to move the demonstrators. Later the police decided to let the demonstrators stay when they were given orders to "let them stay" from the Chief of Police in Dublin.

These shots on board the ship were taken during an inspection, when the ships owner Palgrave Murphy invited the press to "see for themselves" It was quite obvious that their co-operation was an effort to "soft soap" the press and newsreel cameraman who were invited.

However these shots may be useful to show the "before and after" story when you see what the horses look like when they arrive in Dieppe.

Horse export story.

Protest demonstrators who picketed the entrance to the North Wall, Dublin where the ships "Theano" and "The City of Dublin" were loading horses for shipment to Dieppe. They are carrying posters and placards and a large banner with the words, - "Irish Horses face horrors of French slaughter houses; Stop Export of Horses to the Continent" The protest was staged by the Irish National Campaign against Export of Horses for Slaughter. (see inclosed press cutting.-)

A bunch of horses been driven along the Dublin quays and passing at the picket at the entrance to the North Wall, continuing shot shows horses (back view) entering North Wall, for loading on the ship Theano, for shipment to Dieppe. 70 horses were loaded for Dieppe on this ship. (Ship expected to arrive Dieppe noon monday) The City of Waterford did not load to-day Sat, it will be loading Sunday and is expected in Dieppe noon Tuesday) The is carrying 140 horses. Note I was barred from the actual loading, but managed to snatch a few pictures near the end of the loading, also a few shots on the ship Theano.

This film shows. Horses been loaded at The North Wall, Dublin on to the ship Theano, a Dutch boat, for shipment to Dieppe. Shots of the horses in the hold of the ship been given hay by a member of the crew. Also shot of the name of ship, Theano.
