Many thousand Jews and Gentiles marched from Marble Arch to the German Embassy, in silent protest against the resurgence of anti-semitism in Germany. Prominent non-Jewish marchers included Dr. Donald Soper. The organisers claimed that the demonstrators mumbered as many as 50,000.

In Belgrave Square, where the Germany Rubassy is situated, the marchers were joined by the Bishop of Southwark, Dr. Stockwood. There, too, was a woman, Mrs. Claudette Kennedy, in the blue and grey striped dress she wore when a prisoner at Auschwitz.
