JAPAN - U.S. BUILD NEW COOPERATION

Japan's Premier Nobusuke Kishi is greeted by Vice President Nixon as he arrives in Washington for meetings with the President and Secretary of State Herter. He is signing a new treaty of cooperation with the U.S. Mr. Nixon says: (TALK) Premier Kishi's pleasant reception in Washington follows a bit of trouble back in Tokyo, where about 700 leftist students tried to prevent his departure. Members of a small political group too radical even for the Communists, they blockaded the airport stairs, but their demonstration ended in an unsuccessful scuffle at the airport restaurant. They were crowded there as a well-organized contingent of police moved in, carefully avoiding the use of clubs. After getting some resistance, the police soon got the agitators out of the terminal. Seventy-eight of their youthful leaders were arrested. Premier Kishi arrived later by a detour and safely boarded his plane for America.
