THEY DIVED 7 MILES.

Released by the U.S. Navy come these first films of the Bathyscaphe Trieste, rolling in heavy seas after the deepest dive ever made by man. Jacques Piccard and Lieutenant Walsh went down 7 miles into Marianas Trench, greatest known depth in the world. During their 20 minutes on the seabed they saw fish, despite pressure of eight tons to the square inch.

Another strange craft was tested in the ice waters of Lake Erie. It's an escape capsule for ocean-crossing bombers. With a man inside, it had just ended a three-day tryout. As well as supplies, it has rescue-signalling apparatus. Gently does it, because Airman Bruce Barwise has had 72 hours cocooned up in there. You wouldn't think there was room for a man to spend that long inside without getting cramp. Well, appearances are deceptive.

Barwise was little the worse for it, after the longest three days of his life. He just wanted a bath and a warm meal. Six pounds lighter; otherwise okay.
