## WORLD BOBSLED IN CORTINA

The world four man bobsled championship was postponed a week because of an unprecedented warm wave which struck the high Cortina Valley just after the two man bobsled championship. Rain had fallen almost steadily since, on the melting snowfields of Cortina.

the "flying red" who had won the two man bobsled has won also the four man bobsled competition.

Eugenio Monti who won for the fourth running time the two man world title, has won now also the four man bobsled world title: this is the first time for the Italian colors after thirty years that Italy is world champion for the four man bobsled.

Not only, but with an outstanding driving down Eugenio Monti at the first manches has lowered the record of the track with a time of 1'15"44.
