"Wales - Scotland"

Cardiff. February 6th.---

Scotland was unable on Saturday to reverse the losing streak which has dogged her rugby team in Wales since 1937, and at Cardiff since 1927. Since those years, no Scottish rugby team has beaten Wales in Wales, and since the war they have scored only one try and two penalties in seven visits.

And so again this year, the cheerful Welsh crowd was in good voice to sing Cwm Rhondda during the closing stages of the match which the home team won by a goal and a penalty goal (8) to nil (0).

Despite days of preceding rain, sunshine on the day meant that the ground was not hard but was firm enough for open play and there was no discouraging wind.

Consequently the game was fast and open with some excellent fast play by the Welsh half-backs Brace and Ashton. Unfortunately, the quarter backs failed to give them the support they deserved and the quality of the Scottish marking and tackling saved them from defeat by a much bigger margin.

Territorially, Wales dominated the game throughout but the first score came only in the second half. The try resulted from a blind-side break by Brace whose cross-kick was fumbled by the Scottish defender. Bebb dashed up for Wales to snatch the ball and put it down near the posts leaving an easy kick for Morgan for the extra two points.

Scotland missed several chances from good scoring positions but were not able to finish the moves which might have taken the game for them. And finally, a magnificent penalty taken by Morgan from the right touch line put the match outside their reach.
