Waterford, where it is washed, dried and packed in celopane packets and shipped to the United States and Canada Canada.</p> <p>It is washed, dried and packed by the local women in the tiny fishing village of Dunmore East. Every year over 900,000 packets are shipped, to reach their destination in time for the St. Patrick's Day celebrations (March 17)</p> <p>The bulk of the Shamrock is sold in New York where over 500,000 Irish men women and children will "wet the shamrock shamrock" on St. Pabbick's Day. (to wet the shamrock means to drink to it)</p>
