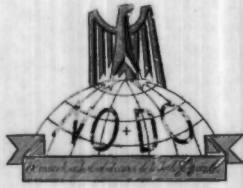

AIR CRASH IN SIERRA NEVADA.-

A US military plane, with 30 passengers - among them a water-polo team - flying from Naples to the Rota Joint Base in Cadiz, has crashed in the Sierra de Jérez del Marquesado, in the province of Granada.

The first news of the accident were carried to the city by two of the passengers of the crashed plane who arrived uninjured to Granada at 9 p.m. of the same day and who reported that 28 out of the thirty passengers were wounded. Although the cause of the crash has as yet not been discovered, most probably it was due to having lost altitude in the mountain range of Sierra Nevada.

The fact that the plane fell on a snow-capped summit prevented more serious consequences.

Salvage was rendered difficult because the mountaineers and troops had to traverse long stretches of snow covered ground. Nine passengers had to remain inside the plane because their condition rendered them unfit for immediate transportation. They were finally taken to several hospitals of Granada, while those who were fit to do so continued their trip to the Rota Base.
