56 fine horses entered the Hunters' Improvement and National Light Horses Breeding Society's spring show at Newmarket. To gain a premium here guarantees a big demand for a stallion's services. In the last year Premium winners have served more than 3,000 mares. Here's 'Fair Risk', foaled in 1951. All stallions in the show are between the ages of four and 18. Prince Silver, a chestnut, was foaled in 1952. Last year's winner of the King George 'V' Cup as supreme stallion, got the judges' verdict again. He's 'Border Legend', owned by W.J. Manning. With Lady horses he's a legend south of the border too. Another winning owner to receive a trophy from Lady Walker-Okeover was A.D. Thomas, with 10-year-old 'Bauble', who evidently wanted to get into the act.
