At the Managers' Briefing on Monday 28th March at 2.30 p.m., Managers' personal duties will be outlined in detail to cover the following points:

(a) Vestibule Duties

Managers detailed for the Vestibule will in the main carry out normal reception duty, controlling entry of the public and politely insisting that patrons should go straight to their seats, pointing out to the public that they will get a better view of the proceedings from their seats, as closed circuit large screen television is covering the arrival of the Royal Party, together with the notabilities, film stars, etc.

When the Royal Party has entered the Circle Lounge, Mr. Dowsey and Mr. Frith will be held responsible for dealing with the late-comers, and ensuring that nobody enters the Auditorium until after the playing of the National Anthem, when the reception area may be cleared.

Managers' Duty Detail continued

(b) Reception Area Entrance

When the Reception Area is in position Mr. Dowsey will be required for duty on the entrance to ensure that only V.I.P's and Presentees use this entrance for entry to the Circle.

Mr. Frith, Mr. Money and Miss Shellard will act as Presentee Escort, escorting the people concerned to the Presentees' Cloakroom in the Circle Lounge.

At a given signal this area must be kept completely clear, awaiting the arrival of the Royal Party.

(c) Stalls - Mr. Bignell and Mr. Robertson

The above Managers will be on duty in the Stalls to ensure the smooth running and seating of the Audience, and to be available to assist in the Vestibule should it become necessary to control the public to avoid congestion.

At the conclusion of the programme the above Managers will be responsible for ensuring that no member of the audience leaves via the back stalls exits until the Royal Party has left the Theatre.

(d) <u>Circle Lounge</u> - Presentation Area I/C Miss W. Smith Mr. Simpson and Mr. Thornton will be required to assist Miss W. Smith in the presentation area.

(e) Front Circle and Back Circle

Mr. Palmer and Mr. Archer in the Front Circle, and Mr. Kite in the Back Circle will be responsible for the control of the audience into this area, ensuring that the audience is seated and all gangways completely cleared before the entry of the Royal Party.

At the conclusion of the programme the above managers will be responsible for holding the audience until the Royal Party has left the Theatre.

At the conclusion of the performance Parties No. 2 and 4 to take up positions as detailed in Flans A and B to cover departure of Royal Party. It is of course understood that Parties No. 2 and 3 will maintain their positions until notified by the management, i.e. when audience has left the Theatre at the conclusion of the performance.

TRAFFIC ARRANGEMENTS

Leicester Square will be closed for normal traffic and the following arrangements have been made with the police:-

(1) Setting Down

Cars CAN ONLY approach by way of Irving Street, South and West sides of Leicester Square and set down facing South outside the Odeon Theatre.

(2) Priority Parking Route

Arrangements have been made with West End Central Police Station for 60 cars to park in Leicester Square, Leicester Street and Leicester Place, and 60 labels have been issued. These labels are designed with the Odeon Red 'O' with two horizontal black lines, and numbered 1-60 inclusive, and marked "Priority Parking Route".

(3) Great Newport Street Car Park

Great Newport Street Car Park has been made available for parking in connection with the Royal Film Performance, and 100 special windscreen labels have been issued designed as follows - Odeon Red 'O', numbered 1-100 inclusive, and marked "Great Newport Street Car Park".

Police will assist drivers using these labels

- (a) after setting down, to proceed to Great Newport Street Car Park
- (b) to enable drivers of these cars to proceed from Great Newport Street Car Park to the Odeon Theatre at the close of the performance.
- (4) In addition to the above arrangements 500 windscreen labels have been issued with a plain Red Odeon 'O' which do not entitle users to any priority parking, but will act as identification for the Police to assist drivers using these labels to proceed to and from the Odeon Theatre.
