

EARTHQUAKE HORROR.

Devastation untold, a death-roll close on 5,000, is part of the reckoning that staggers Chile. In Concepcion, city of nearly 200,000, the homeless are still uncounted. Chile had had six days of it; earthquakes, and volcano-eruptions. The bridge over the Bio Bio River, just outside Concepcion, was still being crossed by frightened people seeking a safe area. Incredibly Hawaii, 6,000 miles away in mid-Pacific, was struck by four gigantic tidal-waves. On surged the terrifying walls of water, as far as the Japanese coast, 9,000 miles from Chile. The town of Hilo, in Hawaii, took the full impact of the waves, and was three-parts inundated. In Chile itself the full fury of Nature was unleashed.
