

SERGEANTS "WALK IT".

Out of the Lincoln Tunnel into the blazing sunshine of New York, marched the two British sergeants, smartly and cool as cucumbers. In 67 days they'd legged it 3,000 miles from San Francisco. The British Exhibition was their goal. The men told reporters that what they'd learned on the long march would benefit the British Army. At the Exhibition sergeants Pat Maloney and Mervyn Evans were congratulated by Major-General Garter. They said they'd never walk it again, not for a pound a mile. They knocked 13 days off the previous record, set in 1926.
