Henley Royal Regatta, unrivalled in Britain, is regaining much of its past popularity. To see the finals the usual fashionable crowd drew a fine day in the letter of English summer. Unchanging River types discussed the probable destiny of the much desired prizes. As usual, competition was strong, the Regatta attracting the cream of rowing talent. For the Grand Challenge Cup Oxford rowed against Malesy, who were stroked by the old Oxford Blue, Chris Davidge. Approaching the finish with Oxford nearest the camera. Malesy were the winners.

The Stewards Challenge Cup. This side, St. Edmund Hall and Lincoln College, Oxford, versus Barn Cottage. The straight course is one mile, five hundred and fifty yards.

Near the winning post, Barn Cottage had a commanding lead of four lengths, winning in the record time of seven minutes and ten seconds. The Diamond Sculls between S.A. MACKENZIE (Australia) and Kocerka of Poland. Mackenzie is considered to be the greatest sculler in the world, but the Pole have him a very hard race. Mackenzie was just too good for him, going on to win by half-a-length. In the 116 years of the race only two other men have won the Diamond four years in succession. Bravo, Mackenzie.
