

LLOYD GEORGE REMEMBERED.

Prime Minister Harold Macmillan comes to Cardiff to honour one of the greatest of his predecessors, David Lloyd George. "A man of rare genius", he calls him - and his Welsh audience have a double reason for agreeing, for the man whose statue is being unveiled today was the first Welshman ever to become Prime Minister of the United Kingdom.

Attending the unveiling in Cathays Park are several of the Lloyd George family - including Lady Megan Lloyd George and Lord Tenby.

The statue, by Michael Rizello, conveys the strength of this man whose leadership in World War One, as Macmillan says, "gave him an authority equalled by Chatham and Pitt before him and Churchill after him. When the odds were the heaviest, he was at his best".
