

OPEN GOLF CHAMPIONSHIPS.

Kel Nagle, the family man from Australia, carries off the "Open" on St. Andrews Old Course - and the way he does it is a sight for sore eyes. A couple of dozen players - including Dick Kemp here - fail to qualify for the last day's play; America's Mr. Gold, Arnold Palmer, starts on the last 18 four strokes down on his Australian rival - and it's a battle all the way round.

Vicenzo of Mexico is even closer on his heels than Palmer. The rain doesn't help, but it doesn't deter Nagle, either. Splashing his way to the last green, he can afford two putts to win.

Several hearts miss a beat - but not Nagle's.

So it's victory by one stroke to the 39-year-old father of four, from Sydney. And 15,000 people tell him that's he's earned his passage home - Cup and all:
