

QUEEN'S PRIZE AT BISLEY.

Nine hundred yards is a long way for a rifle - but these are some of the finest marksmen in the world, competing at Bisley for the highest trophy of all - the Queen's Prize. The Queen herself is here - and many Commonwealth visitors have their first sight of their Sovereign. This year is the hundredth anniversary of the Queens Prize, which was started by Queen Victoria.

The expression "marksman" includes "markswoman" - crack shots like Miss Judy Caulton, for instance.

Possible score in the Queen's Prize competition is 300 - and as the results pile up, some of them are getting pretty near it.

And the winner - Sergeant G. Westling of Vancouver, British Columbia, with 280; his reward is the traditional ride in the chair, escorted by the entire Canadian contingent.

Oh yes - apart from the ride, he gets a signed portrait of the Queen, a gold medal, and £250 in cash. Nice shooting!
