Reporters and cameramen are suitably screened as protection against stone throwing African mobs. Further scenes of police and troop mobile units.

Foot patrol by both Police and Army units into troubled Old Location to seek out trouble makers and looted goods. Scenes of search party of both African & European armed police and army into homes of Africans in the area. Scenes of native types submitting to search party. Arrested African shown with looted goods found in his home.

Location scene of burnt and looted shops, windows etc.

Burnt out scenes of Africans shops in location. It is a fact that the Africans destroyed shops and property belonging to their own people thereby doing themselves immense harm. Most of the damage was done by hooligans and others, without any political motive behind it at all.

Burnt out car in location.

Broken plate glass and further damage done to the VBantu Press building which belongs to the Africans themselves and also staffed by Africans.
