ATR CHILF MARSHAL LORD DOIDING, C.C.B., C.C.V.C., C.M.C.

Marshal Air Chief Alord Dowding was born in April, 1882, at Hoffat, Danfries, and educated at Winchester and the Royal Hilitary Academy Woolwich.

He entered the Army as 2nd identement in 1900 and served wit the Hoyel Artillery until 1914, when he was attached for duty with the Royal Flying Corps, having qualified as a pilot in the reviews year.

He served with the Air Porce in Prence during the Great war and commended various squadrons there. He was montioned in despatches and received the C.B. and C.M.G. in recognition of his <u>distinguished</u> services during the war.

In 1929 he was appointed to a permanent commission in the Royal Air Force as Group Captain. He commended No.16 Group and later No.1 Group. After promotion to Air Commedere, he was Chief Staff Officer in the Inland Area in 1922 and in Iraq in 1924.

He was appointed Director of Training at the Air Ministry in 1925 and in 1929 was promoted Air Vice-Hershal and appointed temporary Air Officer Commanding in Transfordan and Palestine. In December of the same year he was appointed to command the Fighting Area, Air Defence of Great Britain, and in 1930 became Member of the Air Council for Supply and Messearch, an appointant which he held until 1936. It was during these periods that the expension of the R.A.F. was actively begun and repid progress was made in the development of monopleme types and in increased minument.

In January 1933 he was promoted Air Marshal and the same year received the K.C.B.

He was appointed Air Officer Commending in Chief, Pighter Command, in July 1936, and held that appointment for over four years. During that time the size and importance of the Command increased anormanualy and Lord Douding carried a unique responsibility as its Commander in War, especially during the summer and autumn of 1940, when the Royal Air Force fought its immenarial battle (the Battle of Britain) in defence of the British Isles against the manerically superior Common Air Force.

At the beginning of 1937 he was premoted Air Chief Harshal, and later that year was awarded the G.C.V.C. He received the G.C.D. in Cotober 1940. A barony was conferred upon him in the Birthday Honours of 1945.
