

REFORMATION 4th CENTENARY.

Few if any processions into St. Giles Cathedral ever had more reverence and dignity than this of the Queen, Duke and Scottish dignitaries. They went to celebrate the 4th centenary of the Reformation in Scotland. And how happy it was that the Sovereign should join in the thanksgiving.

In 1560 Scotland turned her back on Rome, and established the Reformed Faith in her national church. Her Majesty now went to the General Assembly of the Church.
