Many photographs were submitted for perusal by the Adjudicating Panel this year, in fact nearly seventy from this area, and our judges found it a most difficult task to select a number for attendance at the Area interviews. The Panel eventually decided that they could not possibly reduce the entrants any further and that a total of eighteen would go forward for the next phase. Accordingly, invitations went out all over the area, to Colchester, Brighton, Bournemouth, Reading, Newbury and many other Boroughs for the selected young ladies to meet the special panel for final decisions.

The special panel met at the Lyceum Ballroom, Strand, W.C.2. on Friday 21st October and consisted of VICTOR MADDERN, the popular film and television actor, his wife JEAN, Mr. R.L. DEVINE, general manager and director of UNIFILMS LTD. and DAVID MULLINS, general manager of the LYCEUM BALLROOM.

All but one young lady attended, she could not because her husband had just returned from abroad for Army leave. Our competitors brought their interested parents, friends and also many managers attended to see their theatre representative go further in the contest. Each young lady was interviewed prior to the complete deportment examination, and then further group allocations were made with other selections finalised. This gave every chance for the girls, and of course the judges, who found the task both pleasant and exacting at the same time.

Interviews commenced at 8.30 p.m. and were not completed until almost 11 p.m. All marking papers were examined by the board, and after further scrutiny the following names were issued as the finalists.

M.C. will announce the prizes for the THIRD COMPETITOR and then call the prize-winner forward. (Short fanfare by Orchestra). Star makes token award with comment and escorts to bottom of rostrum stairs. Side throne staircase.

M.C. announces the prizes for the SECOND PLACE.

Calls winner.....FANFARE BY ORCHESTRA, star makes token presentation.

Escorts to bottom of rostrum stairs other side of throne.

M.C. next announces the awards for the Winner, and then calls for 'Miss Cinema of Great Britain'...Miss.

Very big FANFARE FROM ORCHESTRA AS THE GIRL STEPS FORWARD.

Star greets and places the sash around her, and then presents her with the Cup ONLY.

THE STAR will then escert the Winner up the centre stairs to the throne where she will turn and face the audience.

Star places Robe around her, and she sits on the throne for the

actual crowning.

M.C. and Stewards lead the applause for this moment.

M.C. announces the prizes that each of the other finalists will receive and note that they are all on show for the dancers to view. Calls for a big hand for the losers.

LOSERS WILL THEN TURN LEFT AND MARCH OFF THE BALLROOM FLOOR.

THE THREE MAJOR AWARD WINNERS REMAIN ON THE ROSTRUM.

M.C. indicates that BANDSTAND WILL TURN at the same time calling for a WELCOME BACK TO LOU PREAGER AND HIS ORCHESTRA.
