ARMISTICE DAY MARKED BY RIOTING IN ALGIERS

UNDEVELOPED DUPENEGATIVE : 38 meters - 124 ft

Following official ceremony at the War Memorial on Armistice Day in Algiers, thousands of youngsters and some older persons - in all a crowd evaluated at 5,000 - stormed through the streets, battling police, wrecking ~~innocent~~ buses, smashing shop windows and sacking the U.S. Information Agency's cultural center. All this was directed against President de Gaulle's policy and his announcement of an Algerian Algeria. No moloss took part in the day's demonstrations which turned out into bloody rioting. About a 100 people were reported wounded, 60 among police forces.

Police charged the crowd and threw tear gas after calling three times an alarm. Each time the crowd of youngsters ran away and reformed in another street. Demonstrations and clashes with police forces went on from morning till 6 p.m. when everything went back to order.

Even French Algeria groups made announcements denouncing the demonstrations which seem to have been launched by students, and have had no real organization.
