## Saint Bernhard

The famous Saint Bernhard Dogs are still domiciled in the monastery on the 2.472 m pass. Two passes here unite Italy with Switzerland and Western Europa. Embedded in the landscape of the Mont Blanc mountain-range, the monastery is often visited by tourists and the dogs have retained their great popularity. The dogs, however, are now not used for rescue-parties in the mountains. A dozen dogs are still being kept for breeding - a more or less traditional affair. The monks of the Augustine order care for the dogs and the pups.
