Lancaster House. It was a triumph in itself to assemble the 73 delegates to the Central African Comference. For Nyasaland, Dr. Hastings Banda, (in the centre), had already said he was demanding secession; no compromise at all. At the top table, flanked by Mr. Sandys and Mr. Macleod, the Prime Minister wished success to the discussions. Northern Rhodesian Africans also dislike the Federation. Mr. Kaunda will put their views. Sir Roy Welensky, Prime Minister of the Federation disputes much in the recent Monoton Report. So does Sir Edgar Whitehead, Premier of Southern Rhodesia, of which country Joshua Nkomo leads the African Nationalists. The hope of moderates is that Federation will be preserved, with justice to all.
