BROADWAY CONGREGATIONAL FRIENDLY SOCIETY SHARE OUT 1960

THE FRIENDLY SOCIETY, with 6,530 members (in all parts of the country) is meeting claims this year for sickness and death totalling over £6,000 and is distributing £12,000 at the Annual Share Out - the 55th.

THE THRIFT SOCIETY Share Out to 7,632 members is over £137,000, making a total Share Out of some £149,000.

The cash is drawn from the Westminster Bank Ltd., and made up into nearly 14,000 individual packets of amounts ranging from 10s -d to 25.10 -d, to be collected by members on the two main Share Out days. Other packets are being specially prepared for posting to members who live too far away to call personally.

- 1905 The original Society was founded in December for the "purpose of affording temporary assistance in sickness, and assistance on the death of a member, or member's wife; the surplus funds to be shared amongst the members at the close of the year." These services are secured by a modest weekly contribution.
- 1906 45 members enrolled (of whom 5 are still with the Society), £2 raid out in sickness, with £63 Share Out the first.
- 1913 WOMEN'S SECTION commenced on a similar basis.
- 1918 MEN'S No. 2 SOCIETY commenced for those above the original age limit of 40 years.
- 1934 MEN'S No. 3 SECTION commenced with higher contributions and benefits.
- 1939 These sections were the basis of the Society's work until they were consolidated into the "BROADWAY CONGREGATIONAL FRIENDLY SOCIETY" with a permanent fund established to guarantee the Death Benefit.

The three-fold service of provision for Death Benefit, Sickness Allowances and Share Out continues with a choice of three rates of weekly contribution, (9d, 1s 6d, 2s 3d) for men, and two for women (9d, 1s 6d).

- 1940 The THRIFT SOCIETY was commenced in 1920 for members saving weekly amounts (1s -d to 10s -d) with full return plus interest at Share Out. It was affiliated to the National Savings Movement in 1940 and its moneys support the total of local National Savings.
- 1942 AUTUMN SECTION. A service for those who wish to make more permanent provision for their retirement, provides a lump sum at age 60 (women) or age 65 (men) and, afterwards, a quarterly pension for life contributions from 1s -d per week.
- 1945 JUVENILE SECTION. The younger members have their own facilities and from a contribution of 3d per week are provided with a Share Out of 10s -d.
