The present Oxford Street window will by then have been cleared; and the special Boat Deck scene (see story) will have been erected in its place. The other Studios will be put up later in the day.


All three models will be present, in the clothes they will wear that evening, and a group of amateurs will be on hand to photograph them.

Three Studios For Next ILFORD 'Amateur Night'

First it was one; then it was two; now there's to be three!

Here's the story

When ILFORD, the photographic manufacturers, first thought of inviting anateur photographers along to the Photographic Centre, 133/135, Oxford Street, London, to photograph a model girl free-of-charge, they weren't quite sure what to expect.

Now they say ...

"The response amazed even us. Over 1,000 people attended in two hours, and parties came from all over the country."

So it was announced that instead of one Studio for the next ILFORD 'Amateur Night' on January 5, there would be two.

Now it is doubtful whether even these will be enough, so <u>three</u> Studios are to be erected. Coming in from London's cold streets you can immediately go off to the blue Mediterranean where a glamorous model will be smiling at you from a ship's rail. Afterwards, if you need to cool off a bit, there's a Winter Setting with, on a toboggan, the kind of poppet everybody dreams about. And if you tire of all this (although this is not very likely!) there's a cosy room with an even cosier model, waiting to pose for you there.

No wonder there's such a rush to be in on the next ILFORD 'Amateur Night'. But not to worry, there's room for everyone. No tickets are necessary. All you need is a camera, a film, and some flashbulbs. And if you leave your camera behind, you can even borrow one.

"If you're shy and don't want to take pictures we shall still be pleased to see you ..." say ILFORD. "Anyway, there's a highly interesting exhibition running at the same time called 'Atom in Camera' - so either way round there's plenty to see".

Thursday is a late night in Oxford Street when all the stores are open until 7, and some later. So why not let the women folk shop, while you have a couple of hours on your own?

The ILFORD Photographic Centre is midway between Oxford Circus and Tottenham Court Road. Buses 7, 8, 23, 32 and 73 pass the door.
